

THE FAMILY

The couple, who were married according to Islamic custom (Mrs. EL-WAFI was married at the age of 14 to a man chosen by her father) separated 12 years later at the wife's request. She has a lot of complaints against

her husband: he likes women, but not his family. He goes out with his friends to cafes.

In 1972, Mrs. EL-WAFI left her home and placed her children in the ST. JEAN HOME so she could look for work and a place to live.

The children were at the home for a year.

Mrs. EL-WAFI has lived with Mr. EL-KADI for 3 years. They get on well, but she does not allow him to be involved in the children's education. Their father has come back a couple of times, but the children refuse to see him and even less to go with him. He does not pay any child support.

The mother is a brave woman, who wants to "see her children succeed." So she was a little hasty in applying to the Children's Judge, which she now regrets doing, because the reasons are not very convincing. It is clear that she does have difficulties with Jamilla who takes after her father she says, and over whom she prefers the older daughter with whom she is completely satisfied.

JAMILLA:

She lived with her father and mother until she was 7.

She was placed in the ST. JEAN HOME in 1972 and 1973 together with her siblings. Her mother came to visit every Sunday.

For the last four years, she has been living with her mother, her mother's partner and her siblings.

Prior History

Bone disease treated in France

Education

Pre-school – learning difficulties in reading and writing, child was supervised for two years at a Center by a Psychologist

Elementary School in BAYONNE – repeats C2 in Mulhouse. Behavior and work are unsatisfactory.

Jamilla goes to a boarding school in KINTZHEIM for 6th level. She was expelled in June for disorderly behavior.

Behavior

Jamilla takes after her father, says her mother. She has a bad attitude and she is proud. It is true that the family is openly hostile to the mother, refusing to help her or take part in household tasks. Jamilla feels her mother does not love her and prefers her older sister. She had a hard time being away from her family when she went to the boarding school and behaved badly so she would be sent home. However, the problems are not serious, but the child is not happy.
