

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Having heard Mrs. Jamila Moussaoui, born on June 15, 1965, divorced, two children in the custody of their father. Under guardianship of the U.D.A.F., [Departmental Union of Family Associations] has been hospitalized on several occasions.

Considering that the medical examination performed today shows that

Mrs. Jamila Moussaoui:

- has been under guardianship for 1 month following serious personality problems
Schizophrenia which relapses when she stops taking her medication.
- She cannot lead a normal social or family life.
- She is not allowed to see her children unsupervised.
- DISABILITY LEVEL RAISED TO 80%.

METHODS OF APPEAL

In accordance with the provisions of Article no. 143-23 of the Code on Social Security, the parties have a period of ONE MONTH (*) from the date of this notification to appeal against this ruling before the National Court on Disability and Assessment of Assurance in Work-Related Accidents. This appeal must be sent to the Secretary's Office of the Court by registered letter with return receipt requested.

The regulatory provisions state that whoever loses the appeal is sentenced to pay a fee, but he may be exempt from this fee if an express notation is made in the ruling.

In addition, if the appeal is judged to be frivolous or malicious, the loser may be sentenced to the payment of a fine and even to pay court costs, including those for any investigations or expert reports.

*For insured persons living overseas, this period is extended to two months.

In accordance with the provisions of Law 78-17 of January 6, 1978, regarding computers, files and freedoms, and

particularly articles 34 ff., the right of access for parties involved should be exercised at the Regional Office for Health and Social Affairs.
