>I understand your concerns about depositing all the funds up front. But as

>I stated before, I am not asking for all the funds in advance. You are

>paying this out over a 3-4 month time frame. The only way to pay as you

>go, is to pay rating by rating as I said before. Just to make you feel a

>little better, the state of Oklahoma requires the schools to be bonded. So

>if for some strange reason the school were to close, your money is

>protected.

>

>The school does not and will not guarantee job placement, there is no way

>to do this. How does the school know if you would be a good pilot or if

>you would make a good instructor? I am sure you can understand the

>reasoning in this. We do only hire from within though. So there is the

>possibility that you could work as an instructor all depending on the

>things I just spoke about. But even if you don't work for us, you will

>not have a difficult time finding a job. The way the pilot shortage is

>now, flight schools are in high demand for instructors.

>

>If you decide to join Airman, we can transfer your visa from here. It will

>cost you \$120.00 for the transfer and I send the forms to Texas, so you do

>not have to go anywhere. All I will need from you is your I-94 and the

>check for immigration for \$121.00.

>

>I can give you our bank's phone number if you wanted to open an account.

>You may need to wait until you arrive to do that. Besides you wouldn't

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>want to open one before you came to the states and you need to decide on
>which school you want to attend.
>
>You could rent a two bedroom apartment for around \$400.00 per month. There
>is one apartment right outside the airport that some of our students and
>instructors stay at. I believe they charge about \$500.00 per month.
>
>As far as a websight address, I would try Oklahomacity.com. Oklahoma City
>is the capital of Oklahoma and Norman where we are located is only 17 miles
>south of there.
>
>Thank you for thinking of us about the bombing, that is very kind of you.
>
